Description: Jia Zhangke is "one of the 10 filmmakers that will define cinema's next decade" (Artforum). Jia "may well be the most important filmmaker working in the world today" (NPR). We will study all of Jia's available films, feature films and documentaries that have English subtitles. Objective: To study Jia's contribution to Chinese cinema and to study contemporary Chinese society through his films. Format: Classes will take the form of lectures on Tuesdays to present and contextualize that week's film. Discussion of films and related readings will take place on Thursdays. Films must have been viewed before the Thursday class. While the "lab" screenings are not compulsory, it is compulsory to view all films. They are available at the Media Centre, 3rd Fl. TFDL.
