This course is a comparative study on the development of Muslim societies and cultures from Africa, through the Arab and Persianate world, and into Asia and the West, using an inter-disciplinary approach, set within a framework of cultural history. Attention will also be given to the topic of modernity as Muslims search to relate their heritage to the contemporary world and circumstances.

The objectives of this course is for students to be able to recognize the diversity of cultures in the Islamic world and to be able to analyze the historical processes leading to change and continuity in the Islamic world.

# **REQUIRED TEXTS:**

Although there are no required texts for this course, all course documents and readings will be posted on Blackboard on a weekly basis and students are expected to come to class prepared.

In addition to lectures, class time will also be based on these discussions.

Students will be assessed on their knowledge and critical comprehension of the material covered in class and assigned readings.
